

## Pupil Premium Impact Summary 2020/21

### Headline data

- The percentage of pupils who achieved a Grade 4 or better in English and Maths decreased marginally however, there was a corresponding increase in the percentage of pupils who achieved a Grade 5 or better in English and Maths.
- 67% of PP Pupils achieved their end of year targets. 56% of PP pupils achieved their end of year targets in Maths and Science.
- PP Pupils were over-represented in exclusions last academic year (63% PP vs 37% non-PP)
- Attendance of PP pupils was significantly better than national (79.7% DfE FSM6 Data)
- Attendance at out-of-hours revision sessions was 68% in Maths and 30% in English. Turnout to revision sessions was significantly impacted by the national lockdown in March 2020.

### Use of the Pupil Premium Funding 2019/20

The total funding received for the Pupil Premium for the Academic Year was £152,405. Funding supported the interventions below (see plan).

- After school revision sessions for Maths, English and Science
- Small group tuition in Maths and English and additional teaching sets
- Tailored CPD sessions for staff (Twilight sessions)
- Alternative Learning pathway for selected KS4 students
- Attendance officer to support attendance of students and EWO Support
- Purchase of educational software, e.g. Show My Homework, SAM Learning, and MathsWatch
- PiXL affiliation
- Mentoring
- Breakfast Club
- Financial support for: trips, uniform, equipment, and revision resources for all subjects
