

## **Pupil Premium Impact Summary 2019/20**

### **Headline data**

Progress 8 GCSE outcomes for Summer 2019 for PP students -0.54 (Non PP Pupils -0.13). A progress gap of 0.41 which is in line with national gap figures, but is still too low.

Equivalent Figures for 2017/18 were PP -0.74, Non PP -0.17 and a gap of 0.57

59% of PP Pupils achieved grade 4 in Maths and English combined up from 50% 2017/18.

23% of PP Pupils achieved grade 5 in Maths and English combined

72% PP Pupils grade 4 and above in English (last year 64%).

45% PP Pupils grade 5 and above in English

64% PP pupils grade 4 and above in Maths (last year 68%).

37% PP Pupils grade 5 and above in Maths

17 exclusions for PP pupils in the academic year. 3 students were repeat offenders, accounting for 9 isolations.

Attendance at out-of-hours revision sessions 78% Maths / 56% English.

Progress 8 score for High ability pupils on in year 11 -0.16 compared to -0.87 in 2018

Over 70% of PP pupils achieving end of year targets in Science, 60% or more in English and Maths. We would like this to be 80%.

Attendance of PP pupils was 92.01%, for the academic year which is 0.29% below national figures. This has improved by 1.41% year on year.

### **Use of the pupil premium 2019/20**

The total funding received for the Pupil Premium for the Academic Year 2018/19 was £165,000. This was used in the following ways:

Holiday University/ after school booster sessions for Maths, English and Science.

Small group tuition in Maths and English.

Tailored CPD sessions for staff in Twilight Training sessions.

Alternative Learning pathway for selected KS4 students.

Attendance officer to support attendance of students.

Purchase of educational software, e.g. Show My Homework, SAM Learning, Mathswatch.

PiXL affiliation.

Year 9 Made Project.

Careers days/ IAG/ Careers advice.

Breakfast Club.

24/7 Chaplaincy.
